WHAT IS JURP?

The **Journal of Undergraduate Reports in Physics (JURP)** is an annual peer-reviewed undergraduate published by the American Institute of Physics. It is comprised of physics and astronomy research, outreach, and scholarly reporting. The goal of JURP is to provide undergraduates experience with research, leadership, and the publication process while also bolstering their writing and communication skills. JURP is also an educational tool for publicly disseminating SPS-related research and programmatic activities.

WHAT TYPES OF PAPERS CAN BE SUBMITTED TO JURP?

Papers in the area of pure, applied, computational, or theoretical physics/astronomy can be submitted for the research portion of JURP. Student activity reports such as conference reports, SPS chapter award final reports, SPS Intern blogs, and other special SPS programs can be submitted within the programmatic reports section. All accepted submissions will undergo an editorial process.



HOW CAN I SUBMIT TO JURP?

SPS members interested in submitting for JURP must do so through the SPS online awards application system. Submissions must be approved by an SPS or research advisor before they will be considered for publication. **Submissions are accepted throughout the entire academic year, with a priority deadline of March 15, and a late submission deadline of May 15.** JURP is printed and available online each summer.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO SUBMIT TO JURP?

All current undergraduate SPS and Sigma Pi Sigma members are eligible to submit to JURP. The author(s) must have performed all the work reported in the paper as an undergraduate student(s).
